Dr. Abhay Lodha is a staff neonatologist at Foothills Medical Centre, Peter Lougheed and the Alberta Children's Hospital in Calgary. Also, he is an Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, at University of Calgary. He completed his undergraduate medical degree and postgraduate training in the India. He finished the Neonatal-Perinatal fellowship program at the University of Melbourne in Melbourne, Australia and The Hospital for Sick Children with the University of Toronto. His main areas of research include BPD and long term neurodevelopmental outcomes; and preterm births and health outcomes. He is the Chairman of the Continuing Medical Education in the Section of Neonatology at the University of Calgary. He is a member of the CNN Clinical Research Committee and CNFUN group.



Dr. Kim Dow graduated from Queen's University (MD 1977) and following completion of her residency in Pediatrics, she was awarded a McLaughlin Fellowship which she undertook at Harvard Medical School in the Joint Program in Neonatology. She was appointed to the Department of Pediatrics, Division of Neonatology at Queen's in 1982, was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor in 1989 and to Professor in 1998. She also holds a cross-appointment in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. In addition to being a major contributor to the clinical service of the NICU at Kingston General Hospital, Dr. Dow has participated in undergraduate and postgraduate education and has been a thesis examiner and graduate studies committee member for graduate students in basic science departments. She recently taught in the International Neonatal Training Program at Fudan Children's Hospital and established a fellowship program for a Chinese trainee at Queen's. She served as Head of the Department of Pediatrics at Queen's for two five-year terms

beginning in July 1998. During that time she served on the Provincial Council for Children's Health, on the executive of the Pediatric Chairs of Canada and as a member of the team that negotiated with the Ontario Ministry of Health for two renewals of the faculty alternative funding plan. When her second term as head ended July 1 2008, she became the CNN Site Investigator for Kingston and the EPIQ Site Contact as well as a member of the CNN Steering Committee and the EPIQ Literature Review Committee. She currently chairs the NEC intervention working group and has supervised residents in the writing of systematic reviews for EPIQ and abstracts of CNN data for presentation at PAS and CPS.

Site Consents

A request was made at last year's Annual Meeting in Quebec city to all participating hospitals to consider open reporting in future CNN reports. A letter and consent were sent to the site investigators and hospital administrators. To date, ten hospitals have provided written consents to the coordinating centre. We strongly encourage you to engage in discussion with your administrators and come to the annual meeting with your reply.

For the 2010 Annual Report, site codes were disclosed to the respective site investigators. As in the past, each participating centre receive five reports and additional copies can be purchased through the Coordinating Centre.
